International Development Management (IDM) Fellows benefit from placements in a variety of organizations, working in fields such as health, education, rural development, and civil society strengthening. Placements include positions in research, project management, communications, and monitoring and evaluation.

Project Assistant

Location: Mbeya, Tanzania

Host organization: Aga Khan Health Services- Tanzania

The Fellow will be placed in the field, in direct contact with the community, to better understand Maternal, Newborn, and Child Health issues and challenges, and provoke critical analysis of community health issues. They will participate in the implementation of Joining Hands Initiatives (JHI) activities in Primary Medical Centers (PMCs) and selected districts. The Fellow will also actively participate in the review of the Health Management Information Systems (HMIS) data and registers, and support building systems for regular data analysis of HMIS feedback reports at PMC and district level. The role requires the Fellow to support planning, organizing, and conducting capacity-building of healthcare providers and assist in drafting clear, concise communication documents (papers, reports, summaries, presentations, lessons learned, and success stories). In addition to the above, the Fellow will select and focus on one of the JHI project sub-components of his/her interest in coordination with the project manager.

Graduate Fellow- GIS

Location: Mumbai, India

Host organization: Aga Khan Agency for Habitat (AKAH) India

The Fellow will contribute to a research project by streamlining and updating AKAH's database design and operation for its disaster management and emergency preparedness activities, using GIS mapping and analysis. They will also play a key role in the development of AKAH's mandate of safety, security, and resilience through regular process of carrying out Urban Hazard Vulnerability and Risk Assessment (HVRA) for settlements.

The Fellow will support the Business Department in implementation of reorganizational projects, including refinement of lending procedures, HR structures, etc. They will analyze existing processes and duties, develop proposals for organizational improvement, develop surveys and coordinate the implementation of field research (Client Satisfaction, Quality of Life, Needs Assessment, etc.). The Fellow will also conduct research and analyses in microfinance market (client segments, market demand products, loan terms, etc.), prepare analytical reports, and develop proposals for new products. They will also search for possible funds for new projects, work directly with donor institutions, and support Business Department in preparing and implementing marketing projects (brochures, activities, etc.).

The Fellow will develop an action plan and budget forecast for setting up a decentralized decision centre. The Fellow will also validate the communications tools, reporting and methodological guides, and conduct regular follow-up and evaluation of the pilot phase.
