As the world continued to wrestle with what "post-pandemic" might look like, Canadians from across the country joined us for a second World Partnership Walk Virtual Voyage. Together, we visited Africa and Asia to see how Walk funds have helped strengthen communities and build resilience in the face of growing global challenges like COVID-19, gender inequality, and climate change.

The events of the past two years have reminded us how connected the world is, and how much we do – and have to – rely on each other. The Walk continues to show us that Canadians are ready to respond to the reality of our interdependence, not only in attitude, but also with concrete acts of generosity, service, and leadership in our homes, schools, and communities. In 2021, our supporters raised a remarkable \$6 million to support our ongoing work to improve quality of life in Africa and Asia. OUR 2021 JOURNEY

At the end of the campaign, we gathered for the Homecoming Celebration. With more inspiring stories from the field and uplifting messages from our supporters from coast to coast, we celebrated our collective achievements with our host, Zulekha Nathoo.



Adiba is from a rural community in northern Pakistan, where traditional gender roles often prevent women and girls from making decisions about their lives. As part of a youth group, Adiba and her peers discuss issues related to gender equality and develop public theatre performances on topics such as gender discrimination, gender-based violence, and women's roles in decision-making.

Canada's first global collaboration with AKFC was in 1981, supporting the creation of the Aga Khan University School of Nursing and Midwifery in Pakistan. Thousands of healthcare professionals have since graduated from the school's programs and have gone on to provide lifesaving care in their communities, particularly in rural and remote areas.

The Kenyenya hospital is part of Kenya's public health system, serving Kisii County in south-west Kenya. Canadian support has enabled several upgrades to the hospital: a new operating theatre, renovations to the maternity wing, and training opportunities for staff. These improvements mean that the Kenyenya hospital is better equipped to handle acute illnesses and emergencies onsite, reducing potentially deadly delays.



Early learning sows the seeds for future success. Beginning as a pilot project in Mombasa, Kenya, the Madrasa Early Childhood Programme has gone on to help establish over 200 community preschools and teach over 67,000 young learners with Canadian support. The program has also provided thousands of local women with the opportunity to become trained early childhood teachers and caregivers.



For adolescents in Mozambique, youth health centres are one of the few safe spaces where young women and men can ask questions and get reliable information about their health and well-being. When youth are empowered to make informed health decisions, they and their families typically go on to lead healthier, happier lives. With Canadian support, we're expanding and improving 29 health facilities to accommodate the needs of young Mozambicans.



By working with communities to encourage positive health and nutrition behaviours, improve access to nutritious crops, and integrate nutrition into health systems, we're helping everyone reach their full potential.

Dr. Simiyu is the head of the maternity ward at the only hospital on Ukerewe Island in Tanzania. Before, when Dr. Simiyu and her colleagues didn't have the training or tools they needed to help a patient, they had to send the patient to the mainland for treatment. Thanks to training and new equipment supported by Canadians, she and her team can now provide more specialized care to women and children on the island.



When classrooms closed during the COVID-19 pandemic, Canadian support enabled us to help students, parents, and educators continue learning beyond the classroom through resources, toolkits, training, and communities of practice.


