Our ongoing pursuit of this work reminds us of the importance of understanding and acknowledging history, accurately and completely, to help us make changes that move us towards more inclusive and equitable societies. These reminders will inform our work, in Canada and globally, as we embark on this shared path of reconciliation.




Pakistan


Kenya

Colour the flag

Using the image of the flag at the top of the page, colour the Kenyan flag and learn about why each colour was chosen.



- **Top: Black.** This colour symbolizes the people of Kenya.
- Middle: Red. This colour symbolizes the Kenyan fight for independence from the British.
- **Bottom: Green.** This colour symbolizes the land of Kenya.
- White stripes between the black, red and green: This colour represents peace.
- **The shield:** This is a Maasai warrior shield with spears behind it. The Maasai are a semi-nomadic people in Kenya and Tanzania who herd cattle. Semi-nomadic means sometimes they stay in one place, and sometimes they move around.


Tanzania


Tajikistan

What's in Tajikistan?

Help Seeno share the culture of his country, Tajikistan, with others. Draw three of the following things you would find in Tajikistan. You might need to research what they look like!



- Tajikistan's flag. Look at the top of the page to see what it looks like.
- Pamir Mountains: These mountains are known as "the roof of the world."
- University: The University of Central Asia is a world-class university with campuses in several small, mountain communities including in Khorog, Tajikistan.
- Rubab. This is a musical instrument played in Tajikistan and other countries. It's a lute (guitar-like instrument) made of wood and strings.
- Yurt: This is a dwelling many nomadic people in Tajikistan and other countries live in. It is shaped in a circle and has a wood structure covered by felt or fabric. Yurts are portable, allowing families to take their homes with them (by taking the yurt apart and then building it again in a new place) and move with their grazing livestock.
